## FORT ALGERNOUNE 400<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY SYMPOSIUM AND COMMEMORATION PROGRAM

Dates: October 16-18, 2009

Built in October 1609 on Point Comfort, Virginia, Fort Algernoune was intended to ward off anticipated Spanish incursions: it was the first coastal defense for Anglo-America and, specifically, the Jamestown colony. Algernoune was immediately garrisoned by some forty men under Captain James Davis. Its anniversary will be celebrated October 16-18, 2009 at Fort Monroe, Virginia
